Community Building

The first few days of school focused primarily on community building. We spent time each day as a large group learning about each other- finding things in common with others in our community, playing improv games, etc. We went on an all-school walk through the granite quarries, to the grand lookout, and spent the day together at Silver Lake.

We did a windmill Project! This fall, the students will study windmills as part of a community learning project that spans the curriculum areas. This is based on a book, The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind, as well as supporting literature related to the themes of survival, water scarcity, and engineering

Our opening unit will culminate in constructing windmills and turbines. This initiative will incorporate proficiencies through hands-on STEM activities that integrate academic areas for math, science, history and global studies, art and literature. Environmental awareness will also include landscaping design, climate and engineering projects.

Culinary Creations

We continue to enjoy wonderful culinary experiences with Acorn, as everyday breakfast and lunches are prepared on site. Students participate in meal planning, grocery shopping, meal preparation, while demonstrating kitchen community standards. Every week the menu is varied and optimizes nutritional choices.

Around the building there is a guitar in progress, model windmills being built (by both students and staff!), and furniture design is in the works. There are many art opportunities in the works.
